
FIRST SCENARIO

Your client, a multinational-corporation, undertakes a comprehensive internal investigation in the wake of alleged violations of practices of corruption in your country and a number of other countries.


Lawyers acting for the company in several countries are involved, and email messages, memoranda and other highly confidential information are exchanged between attorneys and company executives.
