

# ECBA COUNTRY PROPOSAL FOR THE INTERNATIONAL DAY OF THE ENDANGERED LAWYER 2026

**Proposal**: designating **the United States of America** as the Focus Country for the International Day of the Endangered Lawyer.

## 1. Justification based strictly on verifiable facts

In the current year, the legal profession in the United States has faced a **systematic** and unprecedented wave of attacks<sup>1</sup>. These include:

- **Executive orders** issued in February and March 2025 by the U.S. President targeting lawyers and law firms for political reasons, such as revoking security clearances and restricting access to federal buildings for firms involved in politically sensitive litigation or pro bono representation.
- A **deteriorating climate** reported by the American Bar Association (ABA), which in March 2025 publicly denounced efforts to undermine the courts, the profession, and the ABA itself. The ABA has highlighted rising harassment, threats, and professional reprisals against lawyers for fulfilling their duties<sup>2</sup>.
- **Discriminatory policies** that interfere with law firms' internal governance and undermine principles of diversity, equity, and inclusion in hiring practices<sup>3</sup>.

The **targeted firms**<sup>4</sup> include but may not be limited to:

- Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison LLP, identified in U.S. media reports as representing clients critical of the administration;
- A **D.C.-based firm** sanctioned for defending **transgender rights cases**<sup>5</sup>;
- Legal teams associated with **the Office of the Special Counsel** in high-profile federal investigations<sup>6</sup>.

### 2. Active participation in drafting the report

The **European Criminal Bar Association (ECBA)** which is among the signatories of the March 2025 Joint Statement<sup>7</sup>, expresses its willingness to contribute actively to the drafting of the report.

#### 3. Reliable local contacts

The ECBA has direct and reliable contacts within **U.S.-based legal bodies and organizations** which have consistently documented violations, supported affected lawyers, and are able to provide verified primary-source information.

#### 4. Potential positive impact

Focusing on the United States would **send a powerful message**: that even legal systems with global influence are not immune to authoritarian tendencies. An international spotlight could pressure U.S. authorities to cease politically motivated sanctions, strengthen the independence of the legal profession, and **reaffirm the universal application** of the UN Basic Principles on the Role of Lawyers. It would also **empower and protect lawyers** currently facing political retaliation for upholding the rule of law and defending fundamental rights.

We urge the Coalition for the Endangered Lawyer to endorse this proposal and to mobilize all available resources to make this year's observance impactful and transformative.
